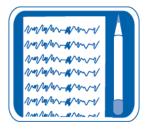
# Flirt English





### **Episode Synopsis**

Write a synopsis of the last episode of "Flirt English" you watched. There are some hints on how to go about it in the blue box.

- The synopsis should be as brief as possible. For a ten minute episode, it should fit on this work sheet easily.
- A synopsis only contains the plot, not the dialogue. If dialogue is important, you report it like this: "Elizabeth asks for a word in private and tells Holly that she doesn't like the boys living with them."
- Only give details if they are important for the story. If Holly goes shopping in the episode, you don't have to tell us what she bought. But it might be interesting with whom she went because it's important for the plot.
- Choose a photo from the episode to illustrate your synopsis. It should show the scene that you think is most important.
